Brother Dantus disappeared for a short while from the ministry. He joined the army as a lawyer, and then moved from Focsani to the center of Transylvania in the city of Cluj. Meanwhile, he found support from his new Church there and restarted a programe in the Gherla Prison. We are very happy for his coming back. May the Lord bless him! As I told you in my November letter, a young Christian social worker wants to join the prison minitry with his church from Dorohoi, near Botosani Prison. Here is their first evangelistic encounter in Botosani Prison. They also wanted to come up sooner in Christmas, and 45 young men in the Church enrolled on the list. Then the prison did not approve of such a large group and told us to regroup 5 people for each possibility. For many years, Brother Hutu

has done the mission only with his family. Now he has received a welcome help. Praise be the Lord! I still talk about different requests from different communities to present prison ministry. There are churches, who really help us and want to get involved in the mission.

Recently I was invited to a Church where I had the opportunity to give good news from

our ministry. Many have prayed for the detainees.
