HANDS OF HOPE ILLINOIS-A BPM PARTNER

Meet Woodie and Catherine Stiltner from Joliet, Illinois who have a very unique partnership with Berean Prison Ministries. Woodie once ran a successful trucking company, but that all changed in 1999. God put upon the heart of Woodie, a vision of using his trucking company in a vastly different way by distributing food to the needy. Their first food drive occurred during the Christmas holiday of 1999. With food donations from KeHE Foods, they were able to make a difference in people's lives. Woodie then began hauling food to a Hope Center he opened that provided a variety of good quality food and produce to the needy members of his community who couldn't afford to buy them. No one is turned away from his unique "pay what you can" center. Once just a vision, Hands of Hope of Illinois is now a wonderful reality of what God can do through willing people who are "hearers and doers of the Word".

At Hands of Hope of Illinois, they live and experience the Gospel every single day. Through networking with local businesses and other food ministries, they are able to provide food, clothing, household goods, medical supplies and building materials to those in need. While they do provide goods to some missions out of country, 90% of their products are distributed here in the U.S.

Today, they assemble everything at their warehouse attached to the Hope Center in Joliet, Illinois and are now distributing on average over 90,000 lbs. of food per week. Through a partnership with Berean Prison



Ministries, Hands of Hope of Illinois annually distributes over one million pounds of food to 13 jails and prisons throughout Illinois, including the Peoria County Jail. They are blessed to be able to share God's Word at many of the recipients' facilities and churches. A prison ministry at Statesville Prison is a byproduct of this work.

Although they are a Christian Ministry and most of their recipients are faith based organizations, Hands of Hope of Illinois does not discriminate against any group or individual in need. "If you are hungry we will feed you."

This journey has become more than a mission for Woodie, his wife Catherine, all of the workers and volunteers. It is their life.


