We greet you all with love. Your support is a great help to all of us, the hand of God in these times of trial. Thank you very much! Thank you very much for not forgetting us and you want the team to stay together. Thank you for the messages of encouragement. In particular, I would like to thank Linda Martin for her kind words. We pray for her.

Some information about us:

We all have to stay home, except for a few volunteers. Those of us who own a yard, a garden is more bearable, but for those who live in the apartment, it is very difficult financially and mentally. Any exit must be justified with a signed statement. The fines are huge for those who have no good reason to leave their home. Thank God, no one got into conflict with the authorities.



First of all, we ask prayers for Brother Bondoret's wife, who is a nurse in a hospital in Bucharest. She fights in the front line. May God protect her and the Bondoret family! His last message: "Brothers! We're fine, Alice is in the front line. Pray for her, may the Lord protect her. Otherwise, we trust our whole being in the Lord Jesus. Be blessed! the Bondoret family"

Andras Attila and Dragu Angel are part of a humanitarian association, which have the right to leave and help people in need, even inmates' families. With food in general, but also other necessary. Our relationship with the prisons has not been interrupted.

For example, I received a request to help MCIuc Prison to buy protective materials for inmates. We can only do this by bank transfer. A similar case was reported by Costin Budoi in connection with Tirgisor Women Prison and Viorel. Viorel wrote:



„Although the activities in the prison were closed due to Covid 19, I managed to correspond with Alin. I encouraged him and helped him financially for his basic needs. It is my great joy to see him grow spiritually, to know him reading the Bible and praying for others, telling him about his faith. He wrote to me: "I managed to go to work and receive a small amount of money every month, so now I can handle financially, please help someone else in need." Alin's words from his last letter enjoyed me a lot. Ilie is another inmate who was released from prison last month and called me by phone to thank me for my help and to inform me that he kept the faith to follow Christ. Glory to the Lord! If the Lord will allow me, I will visit

him. Others: the management of the prison called me and asked me to help them in their projects when is needed. I agreed, of course.
